**Lutheran worship** calls for more standing than in many other churches. Persons unable to stand during the service may remain seated. Also, persons who have difficulty walking may sit in the very front pew and receive communion there.

**Holy Communion** in our congregation is open to all baptized Christians. Lutherans believe and teach that in this sacrament Jesus Christ is truly present to heal our brokenness and empower our lives. Congregants come forward in the center aisle. They obtain an empty glass or, if preferred, a glass of white grape juice from an usher at the front of the aisle, and then stand in a semi-circle. Communicants consume the bread and wine upon receiving them, and wait for the blessing. Then they go to the side aisles, place the communion glasses in the baskets provided, and return to their seats.

**The Scripture Readings** for Sunday, May 8 are: Acts 2:13a, 36-41; Psalm 116:1-5, 10-17; 1 Peter 1:3-9 and Luke 24:13-35.

**What is LBW?** LBW stands for Lutheran Book of Worship, or the green hymnal in your pew rack. It will be your primary worship resource today.
